

Metropolitan Asian Family Services (MAFS) and Universal Metro and Asian Service (UMAS)

Metropolitan Asian Family Services (MAFS) is a Not-for-Profit, Tax Exempt 501(c)(3) organization in 1993 with a mission to provide comprehensive and integrated services to the community at large. MAFS is a multi-cultural and multi-ethnic organization and has at its core, a commitment to educate, assist and empower the immigrant community to adjust to life in the United States and become productive members of society instead of dependent on government aid. To achieve this we have initiated many educational programs such as English literacy and computer training. Through our basic etiquette sessions in dressing, speaking and resume writing we have touched and changed many lives."

Universal Metro Asian Services was incorporated as a Not-For-Profit organization on December 7th, 2000. Our aim is to serve immigrant populations of India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, the Middle East, Latin America and Europe. The organization received its first contract with Illinois Department on Aging(IDOA) to administer homecare services to ethnic seniors in 1993 via Universal Industries.

Our Community Care program is unique. For the past three decades we have been at the forefront of meeting the requirements of the South Asian immigrant community and have since evolved to serve all communities. We are dedicated and determined to provide services to the elderly in their home rather than institutionalized in a nursing home. We consider our participant's cultural and social preferences very carefully before assigning a Caregiver in order to best match their needs.

Breast Cancer

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, an annual campaign to raise awareness about the impact of breast cancer

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women in the US, about 30% (or 1 in 3) of all new female cancers each year. In 2022 about 287,850 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in women and about 51,400 new cases of ductal carcinoma in situ (DCIS) will be diagnosed and approximately 43,250 women will die from breast cancer. Mainly occurs in middle-aged and older women. The median age at the time of breast cancer diagnosis is 62 and the average risk of a woman developing breast cancer sometime in her life is about 13% (1 in 8). During last 15 years the incidence is steady in women younger than 50, however, continued to decrease in older women, are believed to be the result of finding breast cancer earlier through screening and increased awareness, as well as better treatments.

Currently there are more than 3.8 million breast cancer survivors in the United States. Finding breast cancer early and getting state-of-the-art cancer treatment are two of the most important strategies for preventing deaths from breast cancer. Screening refers to tests and exams used to find a disease in people who don't have any symptoms. The goal of screening tests for breast cancer is to find it early before it causes symptoms (like a lump in the breast that can be felt). The American Cancer Society has screening guidelines for women.

- -Women between 40 and 44 have the option to start screening with a yearly mammogram
- -Women 45 to 54 should get mammograms every year.
- -Women 55 and older can switch to a mammogram every other year, or they can choose to continue yearly mammograms. Screening should continue as long as a woman is in good health and is expected to live at least 10 more years.

The major risk of developing Breast Cancer: being female, getting older, inheriting certain gene changes, positive family history of breast cancer (mother, sister, or daughter), cancer in one breast has a higher risk of developing a new cancer in the other breast or in another part of the same breast, race and ethnicity (under age 40, is more common in African American women).

Tests: Clinical breast exam (CBE) by the healthcare provider and breast self-exam (BSE), breast ultrasound, mammograms, newer type 2D/3D mammograms (digital breast tomosynthesis). Women are to be encouraged for BSE, the many of breast cancers are detected by patients. Overall, 1% of the males are diagnosed with breast cancer.

Breast cancer is preventable and mostly treatable, and with the modern technology and treatment the survival is very good if detected early. Please consult your Health Care Provider/Doctor/Physician for screening tests.
